Play a game of I spy with people who live with you. One player chooses an object and says "I spy with my little eye, something beginning with..." naming the first letter of the object they want the second player to guess.

Guess the Sound

Gather up items that produce sound, blindfold one player, and make them guess the item! You can also do this with lyrics and have the player guess the song.

Hide and Go Seek

This is a fun game to play indoors! Have one player be "it" and all others hide once they have found all players the person who was first found will be "it". The more players the merrier!

Tag

This game involves two or more people. The person who is "it" will chase everyone else trying to tag someone with their hand to be the next "it". Another spin to this game is freeze tag where the person who is "it" is attempting to tag everyone out of the game. If you have been tagged they you cannot move unless someone who has not been tagged by the person who is "it" unfreezes you by tagging you.

Pencil and Paper Games:

Hangman

You can play this game with simply two people or a whole crowd. The challenge is for player 2 to complete the spelling of the word player 1 has created before player 1 draws a hangman based on the wrong guesses of player 2.

Tic Tac Toe

Begin by drawing a grid of two horizontal lines dissecting two vertical lines. Player 1 will choose a box to place an "O" while player 2 chooses a box to place "X". The goal of the game is to fill in three marks in a row while at the same time blocking the other player from doing so.

Hot Potato

A classic! Gather everyone in a circle play a song and when the song is either over or one designated player pauses it the one who is left holding the potato is out.

Treasure Hunt

Kids love finding hidden items. You could write clues on paper and in the end, what they find is a prize!

Charades

A single person will act out a word or phrase to a party, while that group guesses the word or phrase. You can also find free charades apps on iOS and/or Android.

If you have a big front/back yard why not turn it into a sports field with items you have at home? You could build a volleyball court by tying a rope between two trees or a soccer field by using two chairs or trees to mark a soccer goal.

LOW COST Austin Zoo

Austin Zoo is a pleasant Hill Country zoo where visitors from around the world can come to learn about and see animals. You are welcome to bring your own food and beverages. Adult admission is \$11, seniors is \$10, children 12 an under is \$8.

FREE Congress Avenue Bridge Bats

You'll want to arrive early to get a good spot for viewing. The bats generally come out right after the sun sets, but they could emerge up to 30 minutes before or after. The black cloud of bats is a sight to behold, and there are several places from which you can get a great view:

- Ann W. Richards Congress Avenue Bridge
- Austin-American Statesman Bat Observation Area
- Lady Bird Lake

Bat viewers can park in the Austin-American Statesman parking lot at 305 S. Congress Ave starting at \$6 for 4 hours. Parking is available at the Radisson Hotel & Suites for a per-hour fee. Parking meters in the downtown area are NOT enforced after 6 PM Monday – Wednesday.

FREE Mount Bonnell

This spot has been popular since the 1850s as a picnic place, hiking area, or just a place to admire the views of the Colorado River. The view is spectacular at sunset. Free street parking is available.
